

ACCESSING SERVICES

General Eligibility for Services

- Must live in one of the counties served by Texana Center.
- Must be age 3 years or older, unless admitted to the Early Childhood Intervention Program (ECI).
- Must have a diagnosis of mental retardation, autism, or pervasive developmental disorder.
- Must meet criteria for admission to specific program.

Information, Admission and Referral

The Information, Admissions, and Referral Unit is the central point of entry for all Mental Retardation Services. This is where the initial screening for eligibility begins as well as the determination and verification of mental retardation, autism or pervasive developmental disorder. Payment for Services

Individuals and families who receive services from Texana Center which are funded through state general revenue are charged for those services based on their ability to pay. Texana Center, as the Local Authority, is mandated by TDMHMR to serve as the community's "safety net" for the clients and families who are eligible for contracted services, but who do not have an ability to pay.

SERVICES

The Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities Services Division of Texana Center provides services and support for eligible persons with mental retardation or pervasive development disorders. The focus of the Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities Services Division is to assist people in choosing and accessing services and supports that best meet their needs.

Services and supports are either provided by the Center or through a network of private and public agencies and organizations in Texana's six-county area.

Texana Center is the Mental Retardation Authority (MRA) for Austin, Colorado, Fort Bend, Matagorda, Waller and Wharton counties. The Behavior Treatment and Training Center (BTTC) serves the following additional Mental Retardation Authorities (MRA's): The MHMRA of Harris County, Spindletop MHMR Center, and Gulf Coast MHMR Center.



Governance

Texana Center is governed by a Board of Trustees appointed by the Commissioner's Court from each of our counties. Trustees work in responsible and accountable cooperation with local and state government and the citizens of their counties.

SERVICES

Service Coordination

Service Coordination provides a single accountable Texana staff member to help eligible individuals to identify, gain access to and coordinate resources and services. Coordination is for services within Texana Center as well as through other community resources.



In Home and Family Support

The In-Home and Family Support Program is designed to provide funds to individuals or their families for the purchase of supported living services and/or goods. The program meets needs that are above and beyond the scope of usual needs and that are necessitated by the person's mental disability.

Transition Services

These services assist individuals approaching 22 years of age to move from receiving services through a school district to receiving services from Texana Center or other community resources.

Supported Home Living

Support and training services are provided to individuals living in their own homes. Services may include assistance with money management, food preparation, shopping, medical and dental appointments, monitoring of medication, transportation, laundry and leisure time activities.

Respite Services

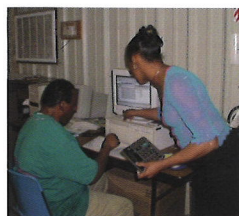
Respite services are offered to provide relief to the primary caretakers. Respite may be provided in a variety of settings to meet individual needs.

Clinical Services

Clinical services may include behavioral services, social work, counseling/therapy, and nursing services.

Day Services

Day services are provided in activity centers with opportunity for community outings and activities including academic, social, vocational and skill development programs. These services train, support and assist people to live and work more independently in their community.



Employment Services

Services are provided to assist individuals in obtaining and maintaining employment. Job placement services provide temporary assistance to an individual who is seeking employment. Activities include assistance with completing employment applications, improving job interview skills, and other activities necessary to secure employment.



Supported employment assists individuals in maintaining their employment. Activities include job coaching, individualized on the job training, and systems to enhance opportunities for successful employment.

Residential Service Options

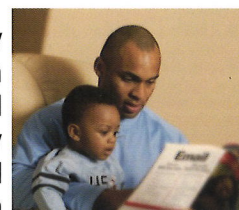


Several residential options are available to individuals with mental retardation, including 3, 4, and 6 bed group homes and foster care. These services are available only through the HCS Waiver program, ICF/MR program or private pay.

Project G.R.O.W.

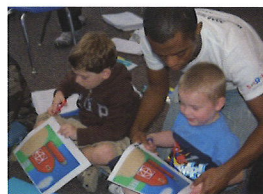
(Growing Resources in Our World)

Project G.R.O.W. is an Early Childhood Intervention Program, affiliated and funded by the Texas Interagency Council for Early Childhood Intervention. The program provides identification and developmental programming for children with, or at risk for, developmental delays. Texana Behavior Treatment and Training Center

The Texana Behavioral Treatment & Training Center (BTTC) specializes in applied behavior analysis. The treatment approach uses extensive "hands on" training and consultations.



Services are provided within a 13 county region and are accessed through the following Mental Retardation Authorities (MRA's): The MHMRA of Harris County, Texana Center, Spindletop MHMR Center, and Gulf Coast MHMR Center. Some BTTC Services are available to residents of additional counties for private pay.

Residential

Short-term residential services are offered by the BTTC to children ages 8-17 with mental retardation or autism spectrum disorders and severe problem behaviors. For additional information about the residential program, Ph: 281.239.1140 or 1.800.304.6047

Outreach

The BTTC Outreach Services are available for individuals with mental retardation or autism spectrum disorders, ages 18 months through adult, with a need for behavior intervention to maintain community placement. Day Treatment Program

The BTTC offers a private pay day treatment program M-F 9am - 3pm for children with autism spectrum disorders. This is not an alternative education program, but provides intense one on one ABA training to teach children the skills necessary to benefit from future placement in a public or private school setting.



Positive Behavioral Supports Training Program

BTTC trains parents and personnel in public school districts and community organizations in applying techniques of Positive Behavioral Supports (PBS) and skills necessary to teaching PBS skills to others.
